

Keynote Sessions:

Roy Faletti

Roy has been actively involved in Christian education for 36 years and has conducted training sessions at numerous schools and conventions throughout the nation. As a Colson Center Fellow, he has a passion for developing a sound biblical worldview in each new generation. He served as the pastor and administrator of a church-based school in Idaho for 15 years and has held leadership positions for Alpha Omega Publications, Summit Ministries, DeepRoots Bible and The Pray for Me Campaign. He currently serves as VP of Customer Care for Positive Action For Christ. He and his wife of 41 years, Mary, live in Colorado Springs and have three daughters, two sons-in-law and two granddaughters.
