

Dr. Renton Rathbun

Renton has been a classroom teacher for over 25 years. His experience has included both secular and Christian colleges and universities. He speaks on biblical worldview and apologetics across the country as well as podcasts, radio and TV. He trains faculty and administrators in biblical worldview all over the U.S. Renton holds a B.S. in English Education and an MA in interpretive speech from Bob Jones University. He has also received an MFA in Creative Writing from Minnesota State University, an MA in Philosophy from the University of Toledo, a ThM from Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary, and has a PhD in Apologetics from Westminster Theological Seminary. Renton is a national consultant for BJU Press.

Opening Keynote

Losing Our Religion in Education: Creating a Stickier Biblical Worldview

Teachers who are confident and courageous are more likely to make a lasting impact on students. Classroom management begins with knowing God, knowing your desired goals as a class, and knowing your students - meeting them where they are.




